### Gavel from the Niwot Home & Garden Club

Naomi Tillsbury was a president of the Niwot Home and Garden Club and this was her meeting gavel. By 1946. Niwot had two hundred residents. A community garden was designed and created at the corner of Second Avenue and Murray Street by a group of ladies who started the Niwot Home & Garden Club. The garden was around the original Niwot bandstand which was a community gathering place and near the Niwot Depot so the flower garden greeted passengers. The women hand dug in the hard clay soil, hauled materials in buckets, carried rocks from their fields at home and local streambeds to serve as borders of the flower garden. The gavel was donated by Nancy Dodd Hindman. Thank You!
