

## Overview of some activities for the Niwot Historical Society in 2024

The Directors and Volunteers keep the organization moving forward with support of our members and the Niwot community:

- Our archives continue to grow with generous donations of Niwot area history.
- We began our research to document the growth and development of the Niwot area since it was platted with Boulder County on March 30, 1875. The first chapter honors the Native Americans who lived on this land before the Pikes Peak Gold Rush and the Treaty of Fort Wise. Chapter 2 begins with the year of the platting of the town and advances through 2024. The book will be published in the first guarter of 2025 for the Sesquicentennial Anniversary.



Our Mission statement says that we share Niwot area history. We share history on our website, in the Museum, at lectures, in newsletters. This is our 11<sup>th</sup> season of creating and sharing holiday greeting cards of Niwot history with current members. This year the featured property is at 190 Second Avenue. The west building opened as a garage to service automobiles and the east building was the Niwot Mercantile which was built in 1907.

Both properties are today the Wise Buys Antiques business.
